

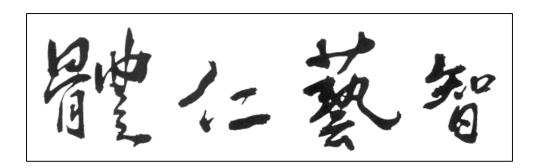
Annual School Plan 2025-2026

1. Major Concern: Equipping Intelligence for Future

Relevant reference feedback and follow-up actions from the previous school year:

- It was suggested that a new measure should be adopted in the coming academic year to replace the homework detention class.
- The collaborative project learning initiative was a successful kickoff last year. The project will continue to run in F.1 and F.2 in 2025-2026.
- It was suggested that more emphasis be placed on the moral and value aspects of Artificial Intelligence. More exposure and experiences with technology should be arranged for students. Additionally, more discussions on the application and impact of AI on life are needed to help students understand and think critically about the ethical use of technology.

3. Major Concern: Enhancing Readiness for Future

Relevant reference feedback and follow-up actions from the previous school year:

- It was recommended to continue organizing the Careers and Life Planning activities under the restructured framework, with the fine-tuning based on the feedback from students and further exploration on partnerships with more local organizations.
- Along with the "National Game" organized in November 2025, sportsmanship and national identity can be emphasized with the introduction of some Chinese traditional sports as tasting options to extend students' horizons on their PE learning.
- It was suggested that different career paths and personal development in VA can be shared with junior form students to encourage them to start life planning earlier and focus more in their personal growth development.
