Major Concern 1: Pursuing Intellectual Excellence

Major Achievements

- The statistics of average "Assignment Submission Percentage" has improved with F.1-4 reaching over 95%, the ideal standard set by the school. The number of students attaining "Perfect Assignment Record" has almost doubled compared to the pre-pandemic years. This suggested that an encouraging population of students has developed desirable learning habits and attitude.
- The academic results of HKDSE 2023 have been improving a lot with some record high statistics since the DSE years. Despite the severe negative impacts of the pandemic on teaching and learning on this cohort of DSE students, their results suggested the possible improvement in the students' learning skills and their learning effectiveness.
- With efforts in revising the senior form electives curriculum and streaming logistics, the percentage of students taking 3X in senior forms significantly increased in these two years. This allowed students to expand their breadth of knowledge and increased their competence for university admission.
- The launching of the e-reading scheme and platform (School Joy Read Club) has been quite successful in promoting reading among students. The school was ranked among the top 5 schools in Hong Kong in terms of number of users and reading hours, and our teacher-in-charge was invited to share our successful experiences with other schools in a seminar.
- The showcase of student-directed projection mapping shown (as one major project of STEM education) on Speech Day represented key evidence of students' ability to learn across the curriculum, applying both their talents in visual arts and their knowledge in science and IT.
- With the aggressive efforts of the Chinese panel, impressive achievements were reported in the area of creative writing with a significant number of territory-wide awards obtained.
- The poster presentation after the F.4 and F.5 Grand Tours provided a platform for students to practice learning across curriculum and apply their language proficiency in daily life. The outcomes of many poster presentations are elegantly pleasing.

Reflection

- The long-term effect of curriculum fine-tuning (elective combinations, impact of newly introduced CSD subject, streaming of mathematics teaching groups) in senior forms is yet to be revealed in the results of HKDSE of later cohorts. Close monitoring and continuous evaluation are necessary to keep track on its effect on students' learning effectiveness and their academic performance in public examinations.
- Students' feedback on assignment load and assessment frequency was received. Ongoing assignment inspections and assignment/assessment policy review may be helpful in guiding students to strike a balance in learning.
- It was noted that some students do not have a habit of doing regular revision (partly because of a busy schedule due to participation in sports and VA activities). Therefore, academic support could be more focused to provide easy and regular reflection opportunities and habit building for those who cannot catch up with academic work.

Feedback and Follow-up

- On top of habit formation, students' classroom learning and study skills could be polished to enhance the effectiveness of self-directed learning.
- LAC implementation strategies (especially in junior forms) could be reviewed to further promote English language proficiency and application in daily life.
- In order to enhance students' competency and readiness for future challenges, teachers could be more well-equipped in areas including information literacy, the latest trends in education, and the utilization of technology for education through staff development programmes.

Major Achievements

- Launched at the beginning of this development cycle, the Whole Person Education Framework has been smoothly put into practice with various activities related to the themes specified in the Framework successfully conducted through different means in spite of the limitations during the pandemic. Teaching materials were developed in accordance with the Form Teacher Period Curriculum to introduce some of the themes for F.1, F.2, F.4 and F.5. In general, stakeholders' survey results reported a well-above-average value of teachers' and parents' perception of Support on Student Development.
- A sense of gratefulness has been highly promoted and emphasized. Students' overall performance in the F.6 Farewell Assembly, Speech Day, and DSE support programmes, as well as their participation in the Appreciation Night, were well-acknowledged and commended.
- Efforts have been put into exploring and providing opportunities to students for leadership training. The adventure-based leadership training camps organized by the Prefect Team and OSC were both well-received with positive feedback from students. We were also the school with the largest number of participants in the 18-day Classic Outward Bound Training Programme over the summer. Most of these students held key student leader positions the following academic year and were empowered to act as role models for other students.
- With the latest resumption to normal after the pandemic, opportunities for students to serve the community and the school were gradually provided. Members of the Ti-I Service Team served as volunteers and student tutors in activities at the Ti-I Yan Oi Elder Academy which included different workshops and a local cultural tour. The Campus Cleaning Day was reintroduced in the Post-exam Period after the pandemic to allow students to serve the school. The above activities were all conducted smoothly with positive feedback from both students and teachers.
- On top of the regular national flag raising routine, activities related to national education were conducted in different modes under the limitations of the pandemic, such as real-time online exchange with our sister school in Tuan Chau, online learning materials and a territory-wide quiz on knowledge of national education, talks and workshops, and a CS mainland study tour for F.5 students. In addition, the completion and opening of the elegantly decorated and furnished Chinese Centre (悦文軒) also allowed students to be immersed in an enriched environment for learning Chinese culture. As reflected in the APASO results, the whole-school average Q-scores for all four subscales related to national identity were above 100 with generally higher scores in senior forms, showing that students are gradually gaining and improving their national identity in secondary school education.
- Right after the lifting of the border control restrictions, two 4-day 3-night Grand Tours to Seoul, South Korea for both F.4 and F.5 were successfully held during the Easter holidays. Students were prompted and taught to compare the different cultural elements of Hong Kong and South Korea, and reported their findings through poster presentations, which also helped them develop and practice generic skills. Feedback from teachers and students was all positive. The Q-scores of F.4 and F.5 students in the subscale of "Intercultural Communication" were 107 and 116 respectively. This reflected that the students have good awareness of intercultural communication.

Reflection

- Based on the experience of the initial implementation of the teaching materials for the Form Teacher Period Curriculum and other activities organized in accordance with Whole Person Education Framework, feedback from teachers and students was collected that may be helpful for us to continue fine-tuning the contents in the next year.
- Limited by the pandemic, community service opportunities for students were very much confined and restricted over the past years. More efforts may be necessary in the next year to broaden students' exposure and experiences in this area.
- Due to the pandemic, the element of cultural exchange in the overseas Grand Tour was limited. The content for cultural exchange and volunteer services can be strengthened whenever possible. After evaluation, the Grand Tour was suggested to be held in F.5 instead of F.4 as students tend to be more mature and cohesive to benefit from the tour. Since both F.4 and F.5 students participated in the program this year, the next Grand Tour for F.5 students will be held in the academic year of 2024-25.
- An Enhanced Smart Teen Project was conducted in Feb 2023 to enhance students' selfdiscipline and resilience. The feedback from students was very positive. However, the objectives were only partially achieved as the program was scaled down to a 2-day Day Camp due to the pandemic.

Feedback and Follow-up

- The implementation of the Whole Person Education Framework will be extended to cover F.3 and F.6 in the next academic year for full-swing implementation in the final year of the current development cycle. Relevant teaching materials in accordance with the Form Teacher Period Curriculum will be developed and those accumulated from previous years will be fine-tuned.
- Riding on the opportunities of the school's 35th Anniversary next year, events and activities
 may be organized to allow students to serve the school in different capacities and to expand
 their exposure and interaction with the community and public.
- Efforts in the area of green education can be stepped up as a means to provide students with opportunities to serve the community and cultivate a sense of responsibility as global citizens to help protect the Earth.

Major Achievements

- Intensive efforts have been put on exploring opportunities and resources from external organizations to enrich our talented students in their sports/arts development. The total numbers of projects involving external resources that the school is promoting/participating in in the area relevant to visual arts and sports are 41 and 18 respectively. A few examples include the Handmade Wellbeing Youth Craft Education Programme (「手作確幸」青年工 藝教育計劃), the AR in Arts Education Project, the PolyU Design Education Corner Creative Workshop in Visual Arts, the LCSD School Sports Programme, the CUHK Sports Medicine Workshop and the Jockey Club Active School Programme in Sports. All projects are welcomed by students and many performed outstandingly by winning awards or commendation by the organizers.
- Alumni have always been a major resource for broadening the exposure of our students. From time to time, alumni were invited to organize sharing and workshops for students to expand their understanding about career and life planning in VA/PE-related fields. Participating students' feedback was very positive and they expressed wishes for more such occasions if possible.
- Close collaboration between PTA and AA facilitated the conduction of the Multiple Talents Experience Day for parents as a parent education programme, allowing parents to understand and gain first-hand experiences of how students' talents in VA/PE can flourish and be turned into a career. All participating parents gave positive feedback of the programme.
- Platforms were provided to showcase students' masterpieces in VA. On top of the annual Graduate Class VA Exhibition, the Junior Form Visual Arts Exhibition was successfully held in the JCCAC in May 2023. Students were also given chances to introduce their works to the visiting public ranging from art professionals to primary school kids. All visitors, teachers, parents and students were fascinated by students' works and their clear narrations. Students' remarkable achievement was highly commended by the Guest of Honour, Prof. HO Siu Kee from VA of CUHK in his social media and publication.
- With our unique mission of developing arts/sports talents, the VA/PE vibe in our school has been consistently vibrant, and the school has been quickly regaining momentum and rebuilding the vibe after the severe interruption of the pandemic. Over 90% of junior form students and almost 70% of senior form students have participated in territory-wide interschool competitions related to arts/sports. A total of 59 students have also participated in 43 national or international sports competitions while the pandemic was gradually subsiding over the past year, and many of them came back to glory with prizes.
- After prolonged planning, the installation of the uptrend bouldering wall was finally completed at the end of summer vacation. The upgrading of sports facilities helped to enhance and enrich the physical hardware of the campus to further expand students' exposure and experience in new sports events.

Reflection

- The restrictions and limitations in the first half of the academic year still hindered the full conduction and implementation of arts/sports activities and programmes. With the full resumption to normal after the pandemic, it is hoped that the variety and diversity of programmes can be enhanced in the following year.
- With the lifting of all anti-pandemic mandates, more parents and alumni were willing and able to come back to school to organize or join activities, which was crucial in establishing and maintaining bonds and connection. Parents and alumni can be invited more often to join in regular activities or programmes organized by the school.
- It was quite evident that students' motivation was greatly enhanced through the
 participation in external visual arts and sports programmes and competitions. Their
 exposure and learning experiences were also greatly enriched. It would be even better if the
 service element could be blended into some of these programmes to provide opportunities
 for students to utilize and apply their talents to serve others.
- With over 30 years of heavy use, many facilities and equipment of the school have deteriorated or become outdated. It is important to plan ahead to gradually renovate and upgrade some facilities to catch up with the recent development in arts/sports to offer better provision to students for meeting future challenges. On top of strategic financial planning and fund accumulation, close monitoring and proactive liaising with different parties is equally essential to the success of renovation and installation or setting-up of new facilities.

Feedback and Follow-up

- Riding on the opportunities of the school's 35th Anniversary next year, events and activities
 may be organized that act as a platform to achieve multiple objectives, including
 strengthening connections with parents, alumni and external parties; extending students'
 talents in arts/sports in innovative events; developing students' leadership to organize largescale whole-school events; enriching students' experiences in utilizing their talents to serve
 the school, and more.
- Collaboration between VA/PE and other KLA subjects shall be encouraged to develop new perspectives and strategies for teaching and learning. This aligns with the school mission and facilitate students to integrate their learning from different areas.

Student Performance

Students' Attitude and Behaviour

Students' general learning attitude has been gradually improving with more face-to-face school contact time during the post-pandemic period. There was obvious improvement in students' assignment submission performance and some statistics even showed better performance than prepandemic years. With a more "normal" and fruitful school life, students generally enjoyed going to school with a positive attitude towards learning in school in spite of the busy schedule and increased workload. However, many students have yet to re-build desirable classroom learning habits and routines to maximize learning effectiveness. Teachers have to explicitly focus on habit formation, learning and study skills as well as time management, particularly for junior form students whose foundation in primary school was much weakened during the pandemic. With our unique student caliber, some groups of students need more constant coaching and stronger guidance in terms of balancing their academic studies with sports/arts talent development. They may lose track easily and have a bias in their motivation and efforts towards only non-academic pursuits. In addition, teachers and social workers also had a hard time putting in extra effort to help a handful number of students who had difficulties adjusting themselves to the new learning mode and environment after the pandemic and warrant our concern in terms of the mental health of these students.

In general, students are mostly well-behaved as evident in the school-based Discipline Performance Index (DPI). While students generally may have occasional minor discipline issues in terms of uniform and mobile phone usage, only a handful of students may have disciplinary problems that warrant more intensive intervention. Teachers' observations suggested that students' behavioural problems were strongly related to their weakness in social and interpersonal skills, that also likely deteriorated because of the prolonged class suspension during the pandemic. Conflicts between students became more frequent after the resumption to normal school life when there were more occasions requiring close interaction and collaboration among students. The extensive use of social media and other online platform also induced potential worries of cyberbullying, an issue where students tend to be less sensitive and vigilant. Concerted efforts among teachers and parents are crucial in addressing this issue in future.
