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
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SCHOOL

School Mission

The vision and mission of the School are to provide students with the normal grammar school curriculum as well as a better chance to develop their potential in sports or arts. The School puts equal emphasis on academic achievement and the development of students' talent in sports and visual arts. By the time students leave the School, they will have acquired proficient language skills, have an analytical mind, the ability to think for themselves and a sound knowledge in academic subjects as well as in sports or visual arts.

School History

The idea of founding the school originated from the late governor, Sir Edward Youde. He proposed the setting up of a secondary school in Hong Kong which would not only emphasize academic performance but also provide an opportunity to develop the students' potentials in arts and sports. In November 1985, the Chief Secretary came to an agreement with the Royal Hong Kong Jockey Club (RHKJC) that such a school would be built in Shatin, with above-average standards for its special task. The Education Department established a Steering Committee to oversee the project. A total funding of eighty-four million Hong Kong dollars was established by the RHKJC and from the Government. Fifty-four million of the funding was used as the building fund while some thirty million was used to set up an endowment fund. The Education Department invited professionals and educators to form the School Management Board to manage the Foundation and supervise the school. The founding members were:







EVALUATION ON SCHOOL MAJOR CONCERNS

MAJOR CONCERN 1:

- 1. Develop attitude to mount intellectual altitude
 - To build up good learning habits
 - To cultivate a positive learning attitude
 - To foster an encouraging learning atmosphere

Achievement

- 1. Evidence Based Practice has been adopted as a school-based approach for examining Learning & Teaching effectiveness in our school. Basing on this commonly shared strategy, various platforms on our intranet, like API (Assignment Performance Index), ASP (Assignment Submission Percentage) and QPI (Quiz Performance Index), have been used extensively to help figure out students' learning attitudes & academic performance. The information is accessible by all stakeholders including students, parents & teachers spontaneously.
- 2. On top of giving students a drive for *Self-Directed Learning* using the above Evidence-Based Practice approach, supportive measures have been developed to further motivate and help students who need extra cares. These include the provisions of:
 - Class Assignment Performance Report as a means to enhance peer encouragement,
 - counselling support from Form Teachers and Form Coordinators for students who have shown first sign of decline in learning attitude,
 - **Homework Detention Class** for students who need extra time to follow up missed assignments.
- 3. The **Curriculum Development Committee** coordinated a review of the school-based curriculum, including the junior form *Visual Arts* and *Physical Education* curricula. Consultations and surveys have been conducted among different stakeholders including students, parents, teachers and alumni. Subjects came up with their revised curriculum plans which would be implemented in the coming academic years.

Reflection

Due to the prolonged class suspension caused by the pandemic, the effectiveness of some of the supportive measures for students, e.g. Homework Detention Class has been affected. Nevertheless, students' learning performance was still kept track of. A wider distribution of their performance was observed.

Follow-Up

The implementation of the revised curriculum would be reviewed by incorporating evaluation mechanisms in normal quality assurance routines (e.g. assignment inspection, etc.) and conducting surveys among students (for junior form *Visual Arts* and *Physical Education* curricula).

MAJOR CONCERN 2:

Enrich exposure to new life experiences with gratitude, initiative and courage

- To strengthen passion to serve
- To nurture desire to lead
- To inspire courage to dream

Achievement

With the momentum brought forward from last school year, all school level strategies stated on the School Development Plan were planned to be fully implemented in this school year with the aim to provide opportunities for students to actualize the major concern. Such school level strategies are:

- 1. providing opportunities for students to **serve** the community and the school;
- 2. opening avenues for students to **show their respect and gratefulness** to parents, teachers, the school and the wider community;
- 3. providing students with opportunities to **expose** themselves to different learning and cultural environments;
- 4. creating platforms and opportunities for students to **share** their personal views and acquire life experiences;
- 5. strengthening career-planning support for senior form students;
- 6. organizing program to help students **explore possible careers** and gain job experience that they might be interested in; and
- 7. using external resources to provide students more demanding and professional **leadership** and discipline training.

Unfortunately, due to the prolonged class suspension and the compliance of the pandemic prevention measures during the COVID-19 pandemic, most of the activities and programs originally planned to be carried out in the second term were cancelled or postponed to the school year 2020-2021. Such activities and programs included overseas study tours, job tasting program, career workshop for F.3 students and F.6 farewell assembly, etc.

The following programs and initiatives were carried out in the first term to facilitate students to develop their passions, desires and courage.

- **Elder Academy** The academy was set up to promote communication between the elders and the young. Students would offer volunteer services to the elders on the school campus. Two services, namely Use of Smart Phone and the Making of Decorations for CNY, were conducted.
- "Heart to Heart Project" The school joined the scheme which was set up to provide bench marking for schools and students on their contributions in community services. The project would continue.
- With the support from the U-Hearts, a charitable organization committed to nurture spirit of contribution of youngsters in Hong Kong, a **Leadership Training Program** was conducted to chairpersons of student bodies.
- "Disability Inclusion" Experience Day for students was conducted
- Fund Fair on School Open Day A total of \$39,747.70 was raised for 8 charity organizations
- Student Growth Forum provided a platform for students to learn, share, and reflect personal
 views and acquire life experiences. Topics on responsibility and responsible consumption were
 conducted this year.
- "Responsible ME" Program for F.1 students

- Speeches and performance of graduates expressing gratitude to parents, teachers and the school on Speech Day. Despite the influence of the pandemic, all student representatives did prepare the speeches and the video performance well. What they expressed were really touching and the audience could feel that it was from the bottom of their hearts.
- **Tidying up after assemblies** The arrangement would continue and be extended to other school functions such as the tidy up work after Open Day
- **IT/AV Team** continued to assist video and photo shooting for major school functions. The team was expanding and members participated actively.
- **Teachers' sharing** of their small stories in assemblies. Teachers took it seriously to promote the Theme of the Year which was "Beyond the Limit". Students did enjoy the sharing by teachers very much. The messages behind were subtly passed to students.
- **Students' sharing** Advisors of different parties, including student bodies, teams, clubs and subjects, continued to encourage students to share their experiences gained by participating in programs and activities in assemblies. It becomes a norm for the follow up of activities.
- Channel information (DSE & U admission) to students through emails

Reflection

The programs and initiatives conducted were successful and their objectives were achieved. It was unfortunate that some of the programs that required extended preparation such as the Overseas Study and Service Tours, the Job Tasting Program, and numerous visits and courses were cancelled or postponed due to the pandemic. Hopefully the preparation work will not be wasted and can be transferred to next year. What concerns us the most is how we continue to groom our students under the new mode of teaching and learning with the influence of the pandemic. We all understand that the process of guiding students' development cannot be suspended and has to be carried out progressively stage after stage. Efforts and creative solutions have to be developed to find ways to minimize the negative impacts of the pandemic. Only persistent and prolonged efforts lead to observable results in students' development. Therefore, all programs will be continued in the following school year with adjustments in some programs.

MAJOR CONCERN 3:

Inspire innovation and drive for aesthetic and physical challenge

- To be committed to our passions
- To be courageous in innovation
- To showcase and promote our school

Physical Education Aspect:

Achievement

- 1. A new Sports Centre located at the new wing (3/F) was set up to replace the old fitness room and the Sports Science & Fitness Centre.
- 2. Advanced fitness equipment and up-to-date physiological tests and measurements were installed to enhance teaching and training effectiveness.
- 3. Extend "Mandatory One Sport Team Engagement Policy" from junior forms to senior form 5, all P.E major students in F.1 to F.3 and DSE-PE elective students in F.4 to F.5 were required to join a school team in order to increase the number of student's man-times in sports participation, to widen student's exposure in sports and further strengthen the foundation of various grades.
- 4. New sport items e.g. floor ball was introduced to enrich students' exposure.
- 5. All external coaches were selected in a vigilant manner. New and experienced coaches were employed in boys football, boys and girls basketball teams.
- 6. Coach with good quality was one of the key factors leading to a successful sport team.
- 7. Maintained the school tradition to explore more experienced alumni to help train our school sports teams.
- 8. Monitored team members' performance closely such as the level of participation and attendance rate etc. Follow up measures were taken to deal with any disciplinary problems of team members.
- 9. Maintained closed communication among team advisers, external coaches and parents, hence timely feedback on team performance and related affairs could be made.
- 10. Appraised team members who performed well in the team by giving small gifts, "TAI" awards and good performance grading in report card. On the contrary, actively manage those members with performance problem like frequent absence from team training under newly implemented School
 - Team Policy.
- 11. Junior form curriculum was revised and revamped under new "week-base" system. Curriculum, teaching and learning materials were restructured and revised.

Reflection

- 1. Under School Team Policy, all F.1 to F.5 P.E. major and elective students are required to join a school sports team, close monitoring and supervision are vital.
- 2. More new sports items can be brought to students.
- 3. Team advisers played a vital role in the development and achievement of the team, timely follow up work of team affairs was critical e.g. attendance issue of members.
- 4. Coaching fee of external coaches is adjusted to the market level these two years; it can help maintain the stability of coaching team.
- 5. It is necessary to keep monitoring the smooth operation of new Sports Centre.

Follow-Up

- 1. Continues to strengthen collaboration and communication among team advisers, coaches, parents and the school.
- 2. Continues to keep good attendance of team members in after-school training, timely action

- should be taken for absentee.
- 3. Apart from regular training, more value-added activities like friendly matches and oversea training activities should be encouraged.
- 4. Adopt systematic appraisal system for external coaches.
- 5. It is necessary to nurture a group of students who can assist the operational work in the new Sports Centre.
- 6. Teaching materials in the curriculum will be updated and revised from time to time.
- 7. More different kinds of new sports will be introduced to students to enrich their exposure and knowledge.

Visual Arts Aspect:

Achievement

- 1. Nominated potential students to participate in different kinds of visual arts awards to widen their exposure and experiences.
- 2. The Hong Kong Primary School Outstanding Visual Arts Students Election cum Exhibition have been demonstrated effective throughout the past 6 years. It becomes a popular Visual Arts competition among primary senior students.
- 3. Strengthen Digital and Media Literacy Media Lab programs have been conducted effectively.
- 4. Fine-tuned and integrated Junior Form Basic Design curriculum is completed, and student engaged and interacted with genuine daily life. Assignment brief and student evaluation are implemented as planned. Some good samples are uploaded to team drive.
- 5. Enhancement of Visual Arts Participation Send art activities & competition information to all VA students via official email. Establish the "Most Active Participation in Visual Arts" in each form. Marks for active participation in art activities and competition to be included in Art Appreciation & Participation.
- 6. STEM in VA Building students' capacity in complex problem solving, critical thinking & creativity via junior form basic design projects.

Reflection

- 1. The Hong Kong Primary School Outstanding Visual Arts Students Election cum Exhibition showcases and promotes our school effectively.
- 2. Students' Digital and Media Literacy has been enhanced via the Media Lab programs.
- 3. Teachers reflected that the fine-tuned Junior Form Basic Design curriculum implementation was successful.
- 4. The policy successfully arouses students' interest in Visual Arts Participation.
- 5. STEM in VA effectively develops students' competences of problem solving, critical thinking & creativity.

Follow-Up

- 1. Teaching materials in the curriculum will be updated and revised from time to time.
- 2. The department designed a new junior form curriculum included Design & Communication and Creative Practice (F.1 & F.2), Studio (F.3) while Art Appreciation, Design Technology and Open Project have been incorporated in various projects.
- 3. More courses will be provided for the after-school talented program for junior form students.
- 4. The department will continue the good practice of organizing The Hong Kong Primary School Outstanding Visual Arts Students Election cum Exhibition.
- 5. The department will continue the good practice of conducting Media Lab programs.


